

NEW CAREGIVER SUPPLIES DRIVE



Thank you for your interest in hosting a new caregiver supplies drive with United Way of Southwestern Pennsylvania. This guide includes everything you need to run a successful drive with your group.

Caring for a new baby is stressful to begin with and, for many families, purchasing baby items might mean sacrificing food or other essentials. Programs like SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) do not cover the cost of essential non-food like diapers and wipes. By collecting these basic baby staples, your group can make a huge difference in the lives of families we serve. Your group can help support caregivers of infants across southwestern Pennsylvania by collecting the suggested items. Feel free to add items that support families with young children.

Just remember: all items must be new and unopened.

What to collect:

- Diapers (all sizes).
- Baby wipes.
- Formula.
- Diaper rash cream.
- Petroleum jelly.



Step 1: Planning your drive.

- Pick the dates for your drive. We recommend a two-week period to help create a sense of urgency among your participants.
- Decide where and when people can drop off the collection items, whether it is at an office, church or any place your group meets regularly.
- Do you want to have your group gather at the end of the drive and package the materials for caregivers? If so, pick a date and time for the packing event. Invite United Way staff to join you to help your group better understand how the items will benefit our neighbors. (This step is not required- unsorted donations kits are welcomed as well.)
- If your group is spread out, consider using United Way's [Amazon Wish List](#) so that anyone may participate without having to manage dropping off the supplies. In your cart, please select "ship to United Way" at 1250 Penn Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15222. **Please note:** shipping items to the Pittsburgh office does not limit the distribution to Allegheny County. United Way will facilitate the distribution of Amazon items based on the agencies you select.

Step 2: Decide where the items will go.

- You can choose to give the items directly to United Way so that we may distribute the items to the agency with the most pressing needs. United Way can also equitably distribute your items across our entire five-county footprint.
- United Way can help you select one agency to receive the materials based on proximity to your home or office or an agency that most closely aligns with your philanthropic goals.
- You may also select an agency with which you already have an established relationship to receive all the materials from your drive.

Step 3: Promote your drive.

- Included in this toolkit are templates you can easily use to promote your drive. You are also welcome to use your own materials.
- Email the participants to let them know your group is collection. Be sure to include WHY the drive is important to our community and how the items will be distributed, either with United Way's guidance or to a specific agency.
- Post on social media to tell everyone about the good your organization is doing for our community.
- Customize the posters using Canva with the specifics about your drive to hang in any common areas that members of your group use.

Step 4: Stay organized.

- Keep track of the items collected as you receive them.
- When the drive is over, complete [this form](#) to share the results of your drive with United Way. (This is particularly important for United Way to plan how to distribute your materials.)

Step 5: Deliver supplies.

- The supplies can either be delivered directly to the agency that is receiving all the materials or to United Way's offices.
